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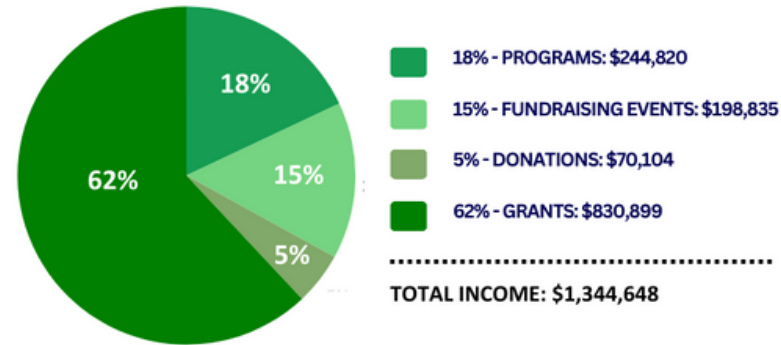

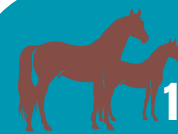
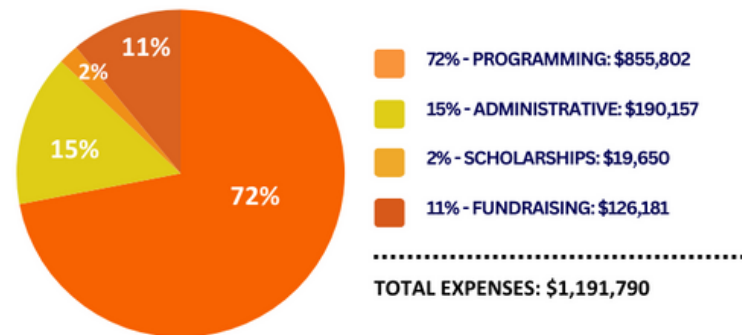

### Proudly Serving Those Who Served

*UpReach is dedicated to serving first responders and veterans programs to help enrich, heal, and improve the lives of those committed to serving our communities and our country.*

Partnerships with organizations such as The NH Veterans Administration, Manchester, Swim With a Mission, FORGE, Camp Resilience, and the Military and Veterans Suicide Prevention Council allow UpReach to offer equine-assisted services to first responders and veterans.

For many veterans, mental health programming that offers equine-assisted services as an alternative, or as an adjunct to more traditional therapies, has proven beneficial as they seek to improve their overall mental health and wellness, continue to heal, and build resilience.

### Offering Safety, Inclusion and Healing

*Utilizing a trauma-informed approach to offer a safe space for adults, children, and families to begin to heal from experiences that may have been traumatic.*

UpReach collaborates with local Adverse Childhood Experiences Response Teams (ACERT), Child Advocacy Centers, and other youth-serving organizations to provide services essential to aiding in recovery, building healthy coping mechanisms and communication skills for self advocacy.

Equine assisted services are effective in helping survivors cultivate feeling calm and relaxed as they build confidence, learn to establish boundaries, and effectively regulate emotions.

*"I love to come to the barn to be with the horses and ponies. They don't judge you for what you've been through. They just want you to make them feel safe and respected -the same as me. I like spending time with them, and with the other kids in my group."*

## On the Road...



### Building Awareness, Sharing the Joy

*Meeting participants where they are is part of all we do; sometimes we need to bring the ponies to the people.*

UpReach Mobile Programming provides expanded outreach to meet participants in their schools, communities and neighborhoods. We partnered with Merrimack County through the Equine Collaborative with Merrimack County (ECMC) to bring ponies and programs to adults and youth in Boscawen, Franklin, and surrounding towns.

Supporting the Sununu Youth Services Center with equine programming. Engaging children and families by bringing ponies to community events.

We are committed to building connections between people and horses to improve lives.
